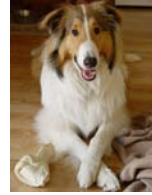

Basic Obedience II (6 weeks) – February 22, 2003

Skills Learned:

- Heeling
- Right/Left Turns while Heeling (Verbal and hand signal commands)
- About Turns while Heeling
- Finish while Heeling (Verbal and hand signal commands)
- Staple Downs
- Long Sit, Down, and Stand Stays (With and without distance)
- Come from a Distance into a Sit (On and off leash commands)
- Off Leash Commands (Verbal and hand signal commands)
- Greet Guest by Saying Hello (The position, not English yet...)
- Targeting (Touch and pick up objects)
- Bowing and Bell Ringing (To request going outside)
- Improved Reliability of Stationary Commands amid Distractions

Intermediate Obedience (6 weeks) – April 5, 2003

Skills Learned:

- Retrieving/Fetch Objects
- Combination of commands into Behavioral Sequence (i.e., “Put your toys away”)
